Hepatitis B algorithm

Who to test?

At-risk patients

- Contacts of HBsAg-positive people
- People whose mother or close family member has hepatitis B
 - Anyone living with an infected person
- Maori, Pacific and Asian people born in New Zealand and aged over 25
- Immigrants of any age from Pacific Island, Asian, Middle Eastern or African countries



Diagnostic serology tests

- HBsAg—Hepatitis B Surface Antigen indicates active infection when positive
- Anti-HBc—Indicates current or past infection
- Anti-HBs Indicates immunity if >10 IU/L (if HBsAg negative)

If surface antigen is negative and antibodypositive, the patient is immune and no further action is needed.

The Hepatitis Foundation will organise:

- Additional blood tests and investigations: HBeAg liver function tests (LFTs), alphafetoprotein (AFP), Full Blood Count (FBC), INR.
- Liverultrasound for raised AFP, high-risk patients with a family history of hepatocellular cancer (HCC liver cancer)
- Long-term monitoring including six-monthly blood

tests (or as required), information, education and support. Home visits if required. Free testing of other family members.

• Urgent referral to secondary care for patients with active hepatitis, cirrhosis, raised AFP (excluding pregnancy) and women who need treatment during pregnancy.



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
